

Requirements to become a...

World Heritage City

- **1.** The mayor of the city must sign and send a letter of application to the Secretary General of the OWHC.
- 2. The city must have within its territory a site which represents a living urban ensemble or a property within an urban context inscribed on the World Heritage List with Outstanding Universal Value.
- **3.** The city must also adhere to the values of the OWHC as they appear in the OWHC Charter, a 26 page document.

One qualification needed to be a...

World Heritage Site

- **Cultural Masterpiece:** Represents a masterpiece of human creative genius.
- **Cultural Interchange:** Exhibits an important interchange of human values.
- **Cultural Tradition:** Bears a unique or exceptional testimony to a cultural tradition.
- **Historical Significance:** Illustrates a significant stage in human history.
- **Natural Beauty:** Contains superlative natural or architectural phenomena or areas of exceptional aesthetic importance.
- **Scientific Value:** Represents major stages of earth's history, including the record of life.
- **Ecological Importance:** Contains the most important natural habitats for in-situ conservation of biological diversity.
- **Human Interaction:** Represents a traditional human settlement or land-use that is representative of a culture.
- **Geological Processes:** Represents significant ongoing geological processes in the development of landforms and bodies of water.
- **Biological Processes:** Represents significant ongoing ecological and biological processes in the evolution and development of ecosystems.
